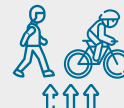

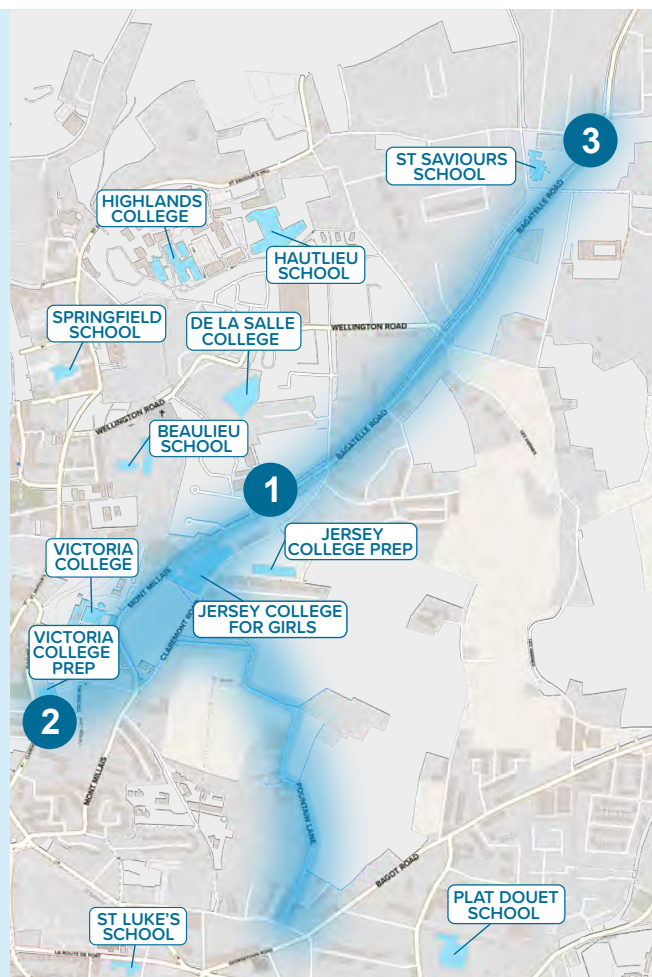
Clarence Road - active travel priority / traffic timed restriction at junction with Pleasant Street, Grosvenor Street and College Hill

Helping you walk and cycle to school safely

St Saviour's School Off Road Shared Path and Pedestrian Crossing

To provide a safer space for children and adults walking and cycling to school, the Government of Jersey are proposing to introduce a new off-road shared path opposite St Saviour's School with pedestrian crossing facilities. The scheme will provide a safer link between the school and Le Clos Paumelle.

PROPOSED CHANGES

The scheme will introduce a 3m wide shared path adjacent to Bagatelle Road with a signal controlled pedestrian crossing to St Saviour's School.

There will be a pedestrian and cycle access point to La Rue de La Retraite and Le Clos Paumelle and on-street parking will be maintained.

NEXT STEPS

Community engagement will take place from July 2025.

Following engagement, detailed scheme design will commence with a planning application for the scheme towards the end of 2025.

Subject to design and funding, the scheme will be introduced in summer 2026.
