ITEM 2: In accordance with Article 5 (1) of the Licensing (Jersey) Law, 1974 as amended, consider the following licensing application for recommendation to the Licensing Assembly:-

The applicant, **Diana Dos Santos**, addressed the Assembly to present the application for the grant of a Sixth Category Liquor Licence for **Georgetown Stores** located at Georgetown Road, St Saviour.

During the discussion of the liquor licence application, the following questions were raised and responded to by the applicant:-

Question: What measures will be put in place to ensure that alcohol is not sold to underage individuals?
Answer: The applicant advised that anyone who appears to be under the age of 25 will be asked to provide valid identification before alcohol is served.

Question: Does the proposed manager have prior experience holding a liquor licence, and are they aware of the legal obligations?
Answer: The applicant confirmed that they have not previously held a liquor licence. However, as this is a family business, the day-to-day running of the business will be undertaken by an experienced employee who is also a family member and has a full understanding of the licensing requirements.

Question: What steps will be taken to ensure that the area in front of the shop remains clear during deliveries?
Answer: The applicant gave an assurance that the area in front of the premises would be kept clear.

On a proposition by Ian Blandin, seconded by Kira Moon and with the Connétable being satisfied that all of the required checks have been completed the Assembly agreed to recommend the application be granted.

Connétable Lewis advised the applicant to appear before the Licensing Bench at the Royal Court on Thursday 19 March 2026 for the hearing of their application.
